Rob- CCI and how it is going this year. The calendars are a hit again this year! We have distributed 1300 calendars already this year and have approximately 700 calendars to distribute. We want to make them available and have them available for anyone who wants them. They are available at Credit Union One, The City Offices and Recreation Department.

Current Hot Button Issues:

Town Hall on Underage Drinking: Discussed what has been done in the past with hosting an actual town hall meeting, presentation at Woodrow Wilson, Sing-Along at Lincoln Elementary, etc. Alli suggested the possibility of combining with another Town Hall Meeting or activity going on in the community and taking 5-10 minutes to discuss Underage Drinking. This way they are not only hearing about underage drinking but are hearing other messages as well and won't waste their time hearing something that they may already know.

Terry- Likes Alli's idea but is wondering how it would work if we focused on the protective factors associated with underage drinking.

Jennifer- Suggested that if we piggy back with another meeting or activity that we group with a meeting that involves parents and families rather than an economic development town hall meeting, etc.

Rob- Really likes Terry's idea and will brainstorm ideas in order to further pursue this idea. Instead of focusing on why underage drinking is bad, using this meeting to promote eating dinner as a family at least one night a week. This is a huge protective factor to reduce underage drinking. There is a \$500 stipend for this activity so we as a coalition would not be spending any money. Motion- Go ahead and

apply for stipend, that we are participating in the National Town Hall Meeting- Motion made to move forward with this application. No one was against the motion. **EMAIL OUT THE SHARP DATA SHOWING UNDERAGE DRINKING RATES AND THE BENEFITS OF EATING DINNER TOGETHER AS A FAMILY.**

Alcohol Privatization-

Reducing risk factors and adding protective factors. Mayor Wood-really trying to improve economic development in SSL. Would the privatization of alcohol sales in SSL be a potential gain or loss for the city? At this point, little research has been done regarding this but will be meeting with Mayor Wood to discuss this further. This may be an issue that comes up either this year or next by the legislators. As a coalition, Rob is wondering where we stand as a whole in case this issue does come up at our **Utah Alcohol and Drug Prevention Coalitions (name??) send out blog about issue- being revisited at Key Leaders Meeting. Reminder that this is what the coalition wants and not SPF-SIG**

Studies done on privatized with certain regulations- privatization done in different ways such as Trader Joes versus a smoke/liquor store with bars on the windows, etc. Any rules on how this would be taxed? At this point, the bill hasn't been drafted.

Statistics showing states that privatize alcohol VS states that don't privatize alcohol sales?? Utah- Our laws contribute to less drinking naturally. 18 control states- Utah is 1 of 7 states who is a full control state which means the state has full control of the liquor sales and laws. Look at data from Pennsylvania-study done by the common wealth organization.

Are there any recent states who have changed over to privatization that we could look at? Washington- was a relaxed controlled state- means you could buy a package license differently than in the state of Utah. Lots of different issue regarding this issue on both sides and statistics show both sides as of now.

There will be a bill this year that will restrict any tobacco shop that has sales higher than 30% for distances away from schools, quotas, limit tobacco paraphernalia, distances between each other (i.e. 1000 feet away from each other). Even though they say that they are a "tobacco shop" they often sale marijuana paraphernalia, spice, bath salts, etc. This bill would help to reduce or stop the sales of these items as well.

Strategic Planning Session- In groups, go through some of these steps for logic modeling and have example sheets to ask "but why?" and figure out the bigger focus. Have been asked to focus our attention around drugged driving, and prescription drug areas. Will meet again the first part of February to iron out the logic models before submitting our grant re-application for this year. *Something else we will consider is the category of Marijuana Use in SSL.

Alli- Reported back on information from take back event. Police Dept. 273.5 lbs. collected, 117.5 at Take Back Events (two-April and October). Totaling: 391lbs all medications combined.
