**End of Legislative Updates-**

- Road Blocks for sobriety elimination-Didn't pass
- Privatization of alcohol sales in the state of Utah- Has been decided that this bill will continue to be studied throughout the next year and may come up during the next legislative session.
- Tobacco Shops Bill- Sets in code language that if for any reason a tobacco shop has its license suspended then they have to meet the new standards set by this new bill in order to re-open.

This affects the city of SSL because there are several tobacco shops that are in zones that violate standards in the new law.

- Huka Bill- No longer allows Hukas and the smoking of E-Cigarettes in public places.

##### **Promise SSL and Key Leader Committee Sustainability:**

- Mayor Wood has set out three key goals for Promise SSL:
  - Every child will have the opportunity to attend and graduate from college
  - Live in a neighborhood that is safe and clean
  - Every resident will have the opportunity to prosper
- As this Key Leaders group moves away from SPF-SIG we would like to propose the idea of moving this group into the Promise SSL framework by becoming the Health Committee.
- Erica Fist- Our new SSL AmeriCorps VISTA member will be initiating some new and exciting health and wellness programs in SSL.

##### **Vote on moving the Key Leader committee to serve as the Health Council:**

- Proposal for Jason Nicholl to serve as the chair of the Promise SSL Health Council. This has not been confirmed as Jason has asked for more time to think about this opportunity. This will be discussed at the next month's meeting.
- By switching to the Health Council, this group would do all the things that we are doing now but as things come up on a city level then we will make the decisions and action plans that we feel are necessary to initiate on a community level.

- Formal motion has been made to form the Promise South Salt Lake Health Council with Jason Nicholl as stand in chair. Confirmed.

#### **Continuation of SSL ARMVC Issues:**

##### **Saturation Patrols in SSL- Easter Weekend-Friday, April 6th:**

- We will be publicizing this event via flyers, posters, banners, etc. to help get this information out. We will target bars and gas stations in SSL and will also post two banners throughout the city.
- Jennifer Smart will follow up with Chief Snyder about the possibility of council members doing ride alongs during this saturation event. More information regarding this will be sent out to the committee members in attendance at the March meeting if this is a possibility.

##### **SPF funding for Saturation Patrols:**

- What types of information would we like to collect from this event? Suggestions: What zones have the highest amount of traffic, where were you drinking, where were you going, etc.

#### **Evaluation factors from Saturation Patrols**

**Update on Stop Impaired Driving work group**

- July was the highest rate of DUI rates for 2011.
- This group is currently working with Dave at Piper Down on ways that bar owners see this working in order to stop impaired designated drivers from drinking and driving even if it is just one drink.
